Breaking Barriers, Investing in Care

Autism rates continue to rise, now affecting 1 in 31 children in the U.S. annually. While increased awareness and diagnostic improvements contribute to this growth, autism remains highly heritable with complex genetic and environmental interactions.

Autistic individuals of all abilities face lifetime barriers to access appropriate diagnosis, therapy, education, medical care, and employment. These barriers are not one-size-fits-all. Just like the autism spectrum, they are wide-ranging from financial and geographical barriers to persistent inability to access appropriate care. Misunderstandings about autism across systems compound these challenges.

Recent research highlights that access barriers are a key predictor of poor quality of life outcomes. Those with greater support needs or fewer local services face deeper, more complex obstacles. Firefly Autism exists to meet these exact challenges. We serve individuals who often have nowhere else to go; children with intensive needs, medically fragile learners, teens and adults, and families facing systemic gaps. Some of our learners travel up to 2 hours round trip daily because no other local provider can meet their needs. Understanding these access barriers is key - Now we must act.

We are delighted to share that we have just completed a five-year strategic plan that reaffirms our commitment to our autism community. Sustainable, high-quality care remains a constant challenge, but it is a challenge we are always ready to face. Firefly is focused on being a resource and a lifeline. Together with our supporters, we are building a future where every learner has the opportunity to thrive, no matter the barriers they face.




